ANSWERS TO FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

- 1. Primary trench (high voltage) must be 3 feet deep
- 2. Secondary trench (from transformer to meter base) must be 2 feet deep
- 3. Call for locates before any digging. The locate center number is 811
- 4. Customer or excavator/contractor must supply the trench with a Sch 40 2 1/2" -3" conduit and pull string
- 5. Average maximum distance for a secondary service line is 250 feet from the transformer. If further, primary (high voltage) cable needs to be installed to within appropriate distance.
- 6. Mason County PUD No. 1 requires a one (1) foot separation in joint trench. Electric cable goes in the trench first, then cover with approximately 1 foot of soil and install other utilities (telephone, cable TV, water lines, etc.) Or separate 1 foot at bottom of trench.
- 7. PUD No. 1 installs all facilities to and including the meter. The meter base and beyond is the responsibility of the customer.
- 8. PUD No. 1 connects to the top lugs of the meter base.
- Customer can install and get State Electrical Inspection on the meter base prior to the PUD
 installing cable. (L&I does not inspect PUD's work) If the meter base is approved, PUD can install
 their facilities and energize service in one visit.
- 10. The customer or contractor must notify the PUD when the State Electrical Inspector has approved the service. PUD requires a 2 to 3 day notice to schedule installation of cable and other materials. (coordinate with the excavator)
- 11. PUD No. 1 requires a signed application for service, valid County address, and full payment of fees prior to installing a service. Under some circumstances a recorded utility easement will be required.
