REQUEST FOR A STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS

Geology-Hydrogeology

In accordance with RCW 39.80, Public Utility District No. 1 of Mason County is soliciting qualifications from Geology and Hydrogeology firms for services anticipated in the next two years. Services required by the District may include retention pond design, deep aquifer analysis, water rights certification, soil inspections and testing, and technical assistance.

The ideal consulting team would exhibit the following:

- ❑ Strong technical expertise in the drinking water and electrical industries;
- ❑ Strong knowledge of federal, state and local laws and policies pertaining to public utility districts;
- ❑ A proven track record in preparing high quality technical plans and analyses within a collaborative process;
- ❑ Strong familiarity with small and rural utility districts;
- ❑ A proven history in completing work that is accepted as technically sound by multiple interest groups;
- ❑ Strong familiarity with aquifer analysis;
- ❑ Strong familiarity with groundwater assessments;
- ❑ Strong familiarity with Water Resource Inventory Area plans and other plans completed in Mason County and southern Jefferson County;
- ❑ Familiarity with Department of Ecology's 2019 Stormwater Manual of Western Washington;
- ❑ The ability to develop and adhere to strict QA/QC standards;
- ❑ Long-term experience in planning and development for public utility districts;
- ❑ Desirable for firm to be on Department of Ecology's Cost Reimbursement Consultant list; and
- ❑ Desirable for firm to have Certified Water Rights Examiner on staff.

- ❑ Descriptions of similar work. ***Descriptions must include the client's contact information.***

Register at <http://mrscrosters.org/businesses/business-membership/> and make sure you choose "Mason County PUD No. 1" as an agency or Mason County in its entirety or Statewide. Decision on selected firm(s) will be made by Wednesday, August 31, 2022. Firms will be contacted via email regarding the selection for our consultant.

The District is requesting submittals for a variety of professional services. You may submit a single submittal that covers more than one service. Clearly indicate on Services Eligibility Submittal Form which service(s) [Archaeological, Civil Engineer, Electrical Engineer, etc.] for which you are submitting your qualifications; there is a form at the end of this packet that must be submitted with your submittal. Your firm will only be scored based on the services for which you indicate you are eligible.
