July Financials – Katie reported gross revenue for the month of July 2022 was \$949,823 and gross expenditures were \$809,418 for the same month. She also reported the performance against the annual budget is tracking within range of 5-10%, taking into consideration the added costs from the January storm. The cash on hand is down slightly, but that's partly due to waiting on reimbursements for grant funded projects, as well as reimbursement from FEMA for storm damages.



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BO GINN WATER SYSTEM EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Bo Ginn water system is located along NE North Shore Rd, approximately four miles west of Belfair. The system is currently a Group B, since it only has 12 connection and a population of 23. The system is approved for 37 connections. It will have to be converted into a Group A and a water system plan written for it to move into Group A status.

There are 2 wells and have a water right of 75 GPM and 25 AC-FT/year. The distribution system consists of 2" PVC mainline with blowoffs. The well house is in older shape, there are six 119-Gallon Bladder tanks, one booster pump and one jockey pump, and welded steel reservoir.

The reservoir is original to the system and is rusted, this will eventually need to be replaced and brought up to PUD standards. The pump house is outdated and will also need to be brought up to PUD standards. There is only one well that is running, and it is located off the pump house. The second well is not active and located in a pit, accessible through a man whole cover. The 12 services are not metered. A yearly water quality sample is taken, and there are no water quality issues.



Immediate improvements would be installing a source meter and service meters, this would cost \$7,000.00. The larger, longer-term improvements needing to be done are rebuilding the pump house, replacing the reservoir with a PVC reservoir, and investigating if the second well will need a new pump and power. If the second well needs to be redrilled, we will see if we can utilize the existing casing. Long term costs, including an eventual WSP can be up to \$450,000. We will apply for DWSRF funding to try to get 50% of the long-term improvements future costs covered by DOH.

Staff's recommendation is to move forward with acquisition and apply for DOH Consolidation Grants.

Dear LSRD Campaign supporters,

We wanted to take a moment to express our sincere appreciation to you all for your support of our pro-lower Snake River dams campaign. This campaign was more than just ads. We commissioned studies, worked with policymakers, partnered with labor and community groups, organized write-in campaigns, and put our members front and center. You are the strongest spokespeople we have, because you are all trusted leaders in your communities.

When we first learned in late-October that Senator Murray and Governor Inslee were going to examine the possibility of breaching the lower Snake River dams, we recognized that if we didn't act, other voices would dominate the process. We are proud to say that every statement we've made about the importance of the dams is true. They cannot be replaced with current technologies without emitting millions of additional tons of CO2 and costing ratepayers billions of dollars. Losing the dams would represent a tremendous hardship, especially to low-income communities and to farmers across the region.

These statements were vindicated today by **Senator Murray and Governor Inslee's confirmation** that it is infeasible to replace the dams given current technologies and infrastructure needs. Notably, they also did *not* call for the eventual breaching of the dams, but instead for the region to work to build the necessary infrastructure so that future policymakers could have more options. **This outcome demonstrates that if we make big efforts that are strategically-focused, we can achieve important results.**

We were also very pleased to see the Senator and Governor's acknowledgement that more can be done for salmon without breaching the dams. Like all of you, we continue to be committed to supporting salmon recovery, including fighting climate change that threatens salmon throughout their lifecycle. Our hydropower advocacy is a big part of that work.

Your organizations' willingness to step up to support this campaign made a real difference to the entire region—even to those who weren't aware of what was at stake.
